
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From The Lille Vildmose Visitor Centre a dirt road, Birkesøvej, connects the centre to the tower at the lake, Toftesø, and there is also a road to the north out to the main road between Kongerslev and Dokkedal. Along the road to the lake Toftesø you watch a channel that was established to drain the lakes so that lake areas could be used for farm land.

Today, nature restoration already has resulted in a re-establishment of the lake Toftesø, and soon the same will happen to the lake Møllesø. The vast grassland then again will appear as shallow lakes with a hopefully rich flora and fauna.

This photo series includes photographs from the road Birkesøvej and the surrounding terrain. I have always been fascinated by the old stalls of wood, which throughout the ages has been used to handle the cattle and the horses when they are transported to and from the summer pastures out here in the middle of the bog. The timber appears rugged and beautiful filled with mosses and lichens.

The stalls are extensively used of the birds when they are singing each with their beak and their tone and tell the world that this is their territory.


