The Høstemark forest and the surrounding agricultural and natural areas are a major section of the northern part of Lille Vildmose.


It is a unique sanctuary, where the audience not normally will be admitted to access. But the rich flora and the fauna spread outside the fenced area. At least 6,000 plant and animal species are registered in The Høstemark forest.

The Høstemark forest is an old grazing forest. There are more than 170 hectares of deciduous forest of which about 133 hectares are natural forest dating back to the Middle Ages or before.

The paths and roads along the sanctuary provide excellent opportunities to find insects, plants and birds that are rare in the Danish countryside.

In the reserve there are large populations of red deer and other deer species, which also can be watch from outside the fence.

There are now established two lookout turrets, which give a good view of the area around the sanctuary. From here we can be lucky to watch the golden eagles fly over the terrain along with the brood of eaglets of this year.
