From east the icy meltwater gushes out from The Greenlandic Ice Sheet. In the Arctic midsummer runoff is huge. The fresh water gushes into the salty water of the fiord to form various shades of the colours blue and turquoise.

The meltwater is arriving from the unknown world under the ice sheet. The meltwater brings along tons of gravel and stones. Grey tongues of deposits are formed on top of the bluish ice, which currently is covered by the melt water.

It is a landscape constantly changing. It is a place with a wildness, which makes it impossible to invade. But here, from the air, we can observe the beautiful forms in this violent place. The colour tones and the shapes appear as a painting done of the perfect artist.

Despite the ferocity with roaring streams of meltwater, excessive degradation of ice and moving of huge amounts of clay, sand and gravel the shapes and colours watched here from above stand as a peaceful harmony that we hardly can find anywhere else on the globe.
